Early Years

Le'Raven Clark was born on April 22, 1993 in Bryan, Texas. Le'raven went to Rockdale High School and was a letterman in football, basketball, and track. He was one of the states top performers in throwing events in track and field. At the 2009 Brenham Regional Qualifier, he took bronze in both the shot put and the discus. The highest he went in discus was 55.47 meters and his highest in shot put was 16.58 meters.

After High School

After high school Le'Raven went to Texas Tech and there he played at the right guard position. He was named a freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America and Scout.com. He was also named an Academic All-Big 12 2nd team selection. In 2013 he was moved to the left tackle position to replace current New England Patriots player LaAdrian Waddle. Le'Raven was named was named a pre-season All-Big 12 selection. Following the 2015 season he got his third All-Big Conference selection and was selected as a 2nd team All-American by CBS Sports.



After College (Indianapolis Colts)

Le'Raven Clark was drafted into the NFL by the Indianapolis Colts in the third round (82nd overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft. He signed with the Colts on May 25, 2016. With them he played in 8 games starting in 3 of them as a rookie. In 2017 Le'Raven played in 15 games starting in 5 as a right guard. March 20, 2020 is the date that Le'Raven re-signed with the Colts. He started in 3 games because the starters were injured but then in week 13 Le'Raven suffered a torn Achilles. He was placed on injured reserve on December 9, 2020.

Philadelphia Eagles

On May 19, 2021 Le'Raven Clark signed with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was released on August 31, 2021 but he was re-signed to the practice squad the next day. On December 8 he was moved to the active roster and then signed a contract extension that ran through the 2022 season. He was put on the COVID-19 list on December 22 but released on December 29. On August 30, 2022 he was waived and then signed to the practice squad the next day..



Tennessee Titans

On September 27, 2022 Le'Raven was signed to the Tennessee Titans off of the Eagles practice squad. In Tennessee Le'Raven did not do anything.



Pittsburgh Steelers

On March 24, 2023 Le'Raven signed a one year contract with the Pittsburgh Steelers. He did not do anything while with the Steelers and was released on August 28, 2023.
